- All performances are **wheelchair accessible** and viewing areas will be reserved for wheelchair users when we're expecting large numbers
- A number of benches and backed seats will be available in performance areas.

- On the day Big Feast **zone signs** and directional signage will help you find your way
- There'll be Stewards throughout the festival including designated **Access Stewards** available for assistance
- In the back of the brochure we've put **suggested itineraries** including a 'Chilled Out Big Feast' to help plan your visit
- We have additional access support on individual shows including relaxed / autism-friendly, audio described and BSL interpreted performances. Check out each event page for details of what's available
- As some of our shows contain loud noises a **Quiet Zone** will be available in **City Central Library**, Fri: 10am-4:30pm & Sat: 10:30am-1:30pm

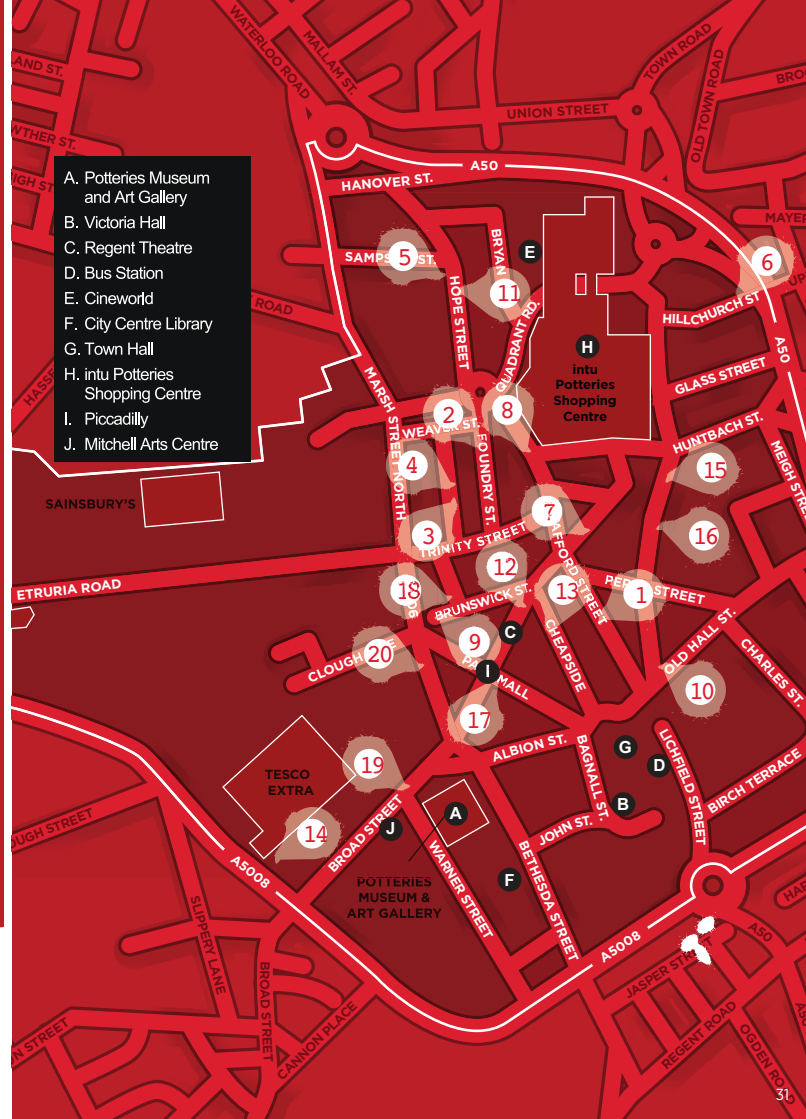

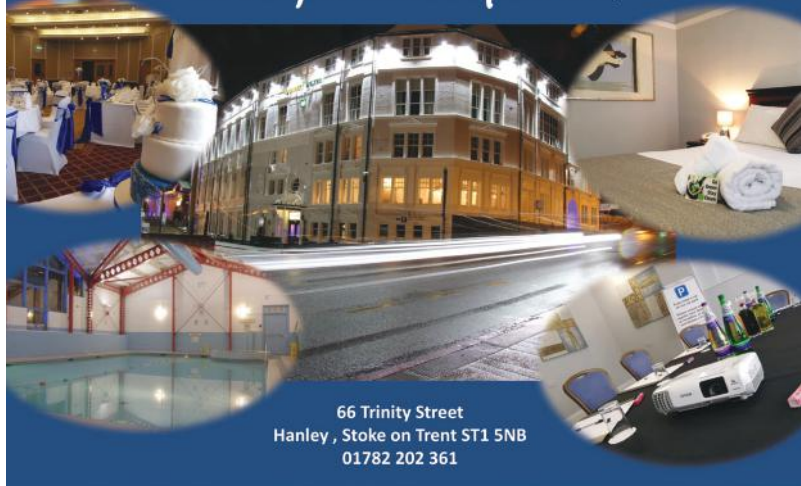
